## January 5, 2010 Stockade Association Board Meeting Actions

- **Karen Mallia, Treasurer, reported** on balances in primary checking account and Smith Barney. One check over \$1,000 written in the amount of \$2022.60 to City of Schenectady for historic street signposts.
- **Infrastructure Maintenance Committee-** Greg Sauer asked for board consensus to suspend pursuit of burying wires. Greg met with Commissioner Olsen about paving Washington Ave. in summer 2011. Greg will continue to investigate period lighting. Greg has work on snow removal plan and has permission from FRC and St. George's to post signs that allow parking in church lots during snow removal by city crews.
- **Membership Committee-** George reports there are 126 members to date. He has sent 51 reminder letters to past members.
- **Events Committee - Future of Walkabout -** Lyn Gordon discussed issues related to future of the Walkabout-no chair person has yet been identified, number of houses for 2010 tour may be impacted as many exceptional homes were on 2009 tour. Sponsorship letters must be sent in March. Board discussed scheduling Walkabout in alternate years with other events to support Stockade Association operation. Some expressed concern that community looks forward to this annual event. Lyn will write up a job description for Chair of Walkabout on her past service as Walkabout chair. No action taken.
- **Secret Garden Tour -** Rob Gavel, chair of 2010 Tour will meet with Garden Group chair, Event chair and 2008 Tour co-chairs on Jan. 7.
- **Committee of Safety-** Beverly Elander reports she continues to seek volunteers Stockade Criers. She will

have sign-up sheets at General meeting.

- **Stockade Gateway Banners** are in production and may be available next week. City will be asked to put them up.
- **Soiree spending plan discussion-** Mary D'Alessandro spoke of plans for use of Soiree funds for the park. Planning group will present to Board at March meeting. Concept drawings are being done by Frank Gilmore for the group.
- **Parking survey -** Greg will send letter of thank you to Robert Petito on his efforts to complete survey. A copy of report was sent to each board member.
- **Preservation proposals-** Lyn Gordon reports met in Dec. with lots of ideas. Group of 5 members have developed a preliminary list. Robert Petito has been asked to join. Next meeting Jan. 21.
- **Website-** Greg Sauer asked members to check the site for improvements and input. Greg has investigated expense of consultation to finalize design. Board authorized consultation expense to provide support with design.
- **Request from Rob Gavel about Historic Quarter Cultural League-** After a presentation by Rob Gavel and a discussion of his request to "merge" his organization "Historic Quarter Cultural League" with the Stockade Neighborhood Association, members agreed to present Rob with a counter-proposal. Board will create a sub-committee of the Events Committee called a Cultural Events Committee and invite Rob to chair the new sub-committee.
- Gloria Kishton announced that **May is National Preservation Month.** In the past the board has presented an award as part of the city celebration. Gloria requests that a vote at Feb. board meeting for a possible awardee. A certificate will be presented.

## Minutes of the January 14, 2010 Stockade Association General Meeting

- The meeting was preceded by a presentation by Dr. Quintin Bullock, President "SCCC, Proudly Celebrates 40 Years of Excellence."
- Minutes of November 12th General Meeting were approved as published in the January *Spy*.
- Treasurer's Report was given by Karen Mallia and included balances in checking and investment accounts.
- Lyn Gordon, president, welcomed Sue Van Heukelom and Fr. Paul Blanch, new rector of St. George's.
- Sylvie Briber, *Spy* editor, spoke of the January *Spy* and asked if neighbors had received this. She also issued invitation for volunteers to write articles of interest for the *Spy* to contact her.
- Greg Sauer chair of the Infrastructure Committee reported on his meeting with Carl Olsen from the City. There will be no street upgrades in 2010 but they are planning for 2011 which may include Washington Ave. Greg advised members that during snow storms snow removal, neighbors may park at First Reformed Church and St. George's lots when signs are posted allowing parking. He also reported that Board has decided to suspend investigation for burying wires.
- Carol DeLaMarter, chair of Events Committee publicly thanked Connie Colangelo and Jennifer Wells and all who helped make Holiday Tree Lighting and reception a success. Added thanks to Diane DeMeo and

team who decorated the Stockade Association tree for Festival of Trees at the Historical Society.

- Beverly Elander from Committee of Safety reported activities of Neighborhood Watch and need for Stockade Criers to serve as Block captains. She would like to identify 27 volunteers to cover the entire area to get the word out when needed. Sign-up sheets and instructions developed with help of Bill Ackerman were circulated. Group is reminder that everyone is welcome at monthly meetings at St. George's 4th Tuesday of month.
- Gloria Kishton, chair of Zoning and Preservation reports that the McDonald family has closed on Millington and Gillette properties on Union St. and have received some of the needed approvals.
- Lyn Gordon reported that a committee to address historic preservation and neighborhood projects has met and will meet again on January 21. Elena Alvarez volunteered to join as neighborhood member. Committee will present a report in March.
- Steve Boese of Ingersoll Ave. had been asked to look into need for flood control coordinator, replacing Helen Witts. After discussion of changing communication using Yahoo and other agencies, felt appointing this position was no longer needed. Stockade Criers will assist when needed.
- Lyn Gordon reported that Stockade Walkabout is still in need of chair person in order to begin planning for 2010. A list of tasks and timelines circulated and a reminder that other committees are already in place to assist. Anyone with interest should contact her.
- Meeting was adjourned at 9:07pm.

# In Memory of Bearie and Fudge

The cruel deaths of two little dachshund puppies and the torturous maiming of a third small dog evoked a very strong and sad reaction from many people. This was not limited to Schenectady but within reach of wherever the sad story was carried. I am not from Schenectady living as I do in Rensselaer County about thirty miles away; but I often travel to Schenectady and last fall I had a couple of occasions when I visited Front Street during two separate trips about a week or so apart. In each case, the weather was nice and so I parked a distance away from where I was going and enjoyed the walk.

On the first of these occasions, I remember seeing a very tiny puppy, so small it had to be carried off a front stoop as it was too tiny to negotiate the stairs. Once on the pavement the little dog started following its master without the benefit of any sort of collar or leash, walking right along with him. The pup seemed totally obedient to and adoring of its apparent master. I was impressed by the animal's sweetness which seemed to add to the pleasantness of the day. I thought to myself "what a nice place to live this Stockade area must be with all these beautiful old buildings and a local resident peacefully out walking and training his little dog." "What a far cry" I thought, "from the bad press often given the city for crime and violence."

When I returned to the same area again a few days later, I thought myself lucky to see the little pup out with its owner, but on more careful observation, I realized the dog seemed larger and that it was marked a little differently than the one I saw a few days earlier. "Well," I thought to myself, "Probably the mother had some pups and perhaps this is a different dog." Once again, I went along my way feeling the

better for what I had seen.

Somehow coming to learn during the last few weeks that these very same sweet, innocent, trusting animals had come to a terrible end, and further learning the owner is standing charged with a horrid act of cruelty, was jarring to say the least. I will never be able to go down Front Street again without reflecting on his unwarranted act of violence.

It is not that I don't keep these things in perspective. Schenectady along with many other American cities has seen its share of murders and all sorts of other crimes. We have grown almost jaded to all the horrible things reported in the media because it all too often seems to us to be happening to other people. How we treat animals however, is a harbinger of how we will treat one another. The very fact that domesticated pets have been specifically bred by humans for companionship and have lost the ability to fend for themselves, renders them truly innocent. As a consequence, when a person turns on an innocent pet with all the pent up anger in them, something perverse has taken place.

However you look at it, this story will not have a happy ending! At least there doesn't have to be a miscarriage of justice. The only meaningful way to honor the memory of Bearie and Fudge is prosecute this crime to the full extent of the law and make sure the perpetrator(s) are kept from walking among us.

**Painting Incentive:** \$150 maximum per property owner is available to help defray costs for painting building exteriors readily visible from the public way, using colors approved by the Historic District Commission. See article to left.

A few years back Mr. Turner's 1/2 inch scale model circus was on display in the N.Y.S. Museum in Albany. The exhibit was to be held for six months, but by popular demand, was there for close to a year. It was wonderful to see. Parts of Mr. Turner's circus models and memorabilia were on display at various libraries last spring. I got to see the set up at Schenectady Library. It was a great showing, as this one is.

As a tie-in with Art Night, Proctor's art director, Mr. Richard Lourich, has invited circus model builder and historian, Mr. Gordon Turner, to display circus posters. The display is in the V.I.P. Room. The exhibit is open every third Friday from 5pm to 9pm. You can also see the exhibit, weekdays, by calling Mr. Richard Lourich, 346-6204 for an appointment. There is also a window display in the 1st floor theatre lobby. The display consists of Mr. Turner's one inch to the foot size railroad car. The car is an exact replica of a Ringling-Barnum Advertising car used during the late 1940's through the 1950's. The original railroad car that the Ringling Show used was from the U.S. Army. The Army used these and various other railroad cars during World War II. The window display also consists of photos, advertisements, posters and some personal memorabilia from Mr. Turner's collection.

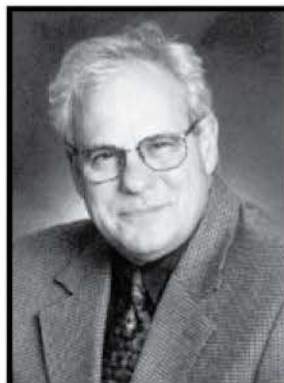

## Adopt A Portrait! 1715-1750 "Faces of Schenectady"

The Schenectady County Historical Society has recently received an important 1720 portrait of Laurens Claus Van der Volgen from one of his descendants. Laurens was taken prisoner during the massacre, lived with Native Americans, returned to Schenectady, and became a well respected interpreter. Another family portrait and artifacts also accompanied this one.

In celebration of this acquisition, the Society has planned an exhibit of all the known portraits of this early period in Schenectady history. Before this gift, the Society owned only one portrait from this period, that of Helena Van Epps Pieterse. All other contemporary portraits belong to other institutions. Portraits include the Veeders, Becks, the Glens, Jacobus Van Slyke, Susanna Truax, Barent Vrooman, John Dunbar and his wife, and others.

To mount this extraordinary exhibit, funds are needed for transportation and shipping costs, installation costs, a catalog to record this assemblage which previously has never been done, and possibly guest speaker fees for a seminar.
