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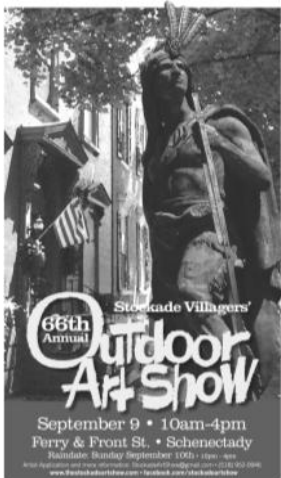

EXCITING STREETSCAPE PROJECT

Tired of tripping on our broken sidewalks? Wish our trees were in better shape? Worry about all the speeders on Front, Union and elsewhere? Many of your neighbors are concerned about the same thing! The Stockade Association has decided the best way to tackle these continuing problems is to create a comprehensive streetscape plan. Such a plan will encourage residents to share their opinions and ideas on the streets of the Stockade. It will build consensus on a vision for the future and point the way towards solving problems with which we are all so familiar!

At the May 2017 General Meeting, association members voted to seek funds for completion of a comprehensive streetscape plan to begin the process of improving sidewalks, protecting and adding street trees and improving traffic safety in the Stockade. The members also voted \$10,000 of Stockade funds towards such a plan.



A subcommittee (Streetscape Committee) of the Infrastructure Committee was then established to seek additional funding and manage the streetscape planning process. Suzy Unger is the chair person of the Streetscape Committee. The other members are Carol DeLaMarter, Keith Dayer, Lily Alvarez, Lawrence James, and Richard Unger. Since the Streetscape Committee's creation, it has raised \$52,000 in grants from the Schenectady Foundation, the Wright Family Foundation and Golub Foundation. This summer, the Streetscape Committee began looking for a design consulting firm to guide the development of a Comprehensive Streetscape Plan.

The Streetscape Committee created a detailed request for proposals in June and sent them to prospective consultants in July. After receiving and reviewing proposals from design consultant teams...

May 17, 2018 7:00pm St. George's Church Great Hall
Summary from Minutes by Suzy Unger, Recording Secretary

Meeting Program: 7 p.m. - Mayor Gary McCarthy was welcomed. Chris Leonard, City Historian, spoke about his new appointment and plans for the future. Assistant Police Chief Macherone, Assistant Chief Mallard, Officer Zampella (officer for Stockade area) presented crime statistics and answered questions about safety concerns.

Open Forum: Gloria Kishton reported on the Schenectady Heritage Foundation and its activities. She invited members to the Preservation Awards Presentation on May 24 at 4 p.m. There will be a workshop on historic preservation tax credits on May 31 at Mt. Olivet Church.

Business Meeting: Carol DeLaMarter called to Order at 8:08 p.m. Keith Dayer moved to approve the March minutes as presented in the April Spy. Approved. Robert Lemmerman gave the Treasurer's Report. President Carol DeLaMarter presented the Annual Report for June 2017 - May 2018.

Committee Reports: Nominating Committee - Dianne Crozier presented the slate of officers and board members for election: Vice President: re-elect Colleen Macaulay; Corresponding Secretary: re-elect Bob Stern; Recording Secretary: re-elect Suzanne Unger; Directors: re-elect Susan Du-four and Peter Rumora; elect Nathan Morgan. Doug Chilton moved to accept the slate as presented. Motion passed. Glenn Houston gave an update on association finances. Spy Report-Sylvie Briber, editor, gave a report on the 2017-2018 year. She thanked Gloria Kishton for her graphic design work, Bob Lemmerman for his work with sponsors, Beverly Elander and John Medeiros for mailing and Owen Miller for delivery. Infrastructure Committee-Suzy Unger reported that a total of \$52,000 has been raised for the comprehensive streetscape plan. Bob Lemmerman made a **motion to buy two more trash cans consistent with the existing design of recent trash cans not to exceed \$3,000.** Discussion followed. Motion passed with no "nays," three abstentions. Safety Committee/Neighborhood Watch-Colleen Macaulay reported on plans for the picnic, the sidewalk sale and the National Night Out. Beautification Committee - Gloria Kishton gave a Garden Tour update. Docents and volunteers are needed. Membership - chair and members needed for work during summer.

New Business - Ms. Kishton gave an update on the fire damaged building next to the railroad bridge on Green Street. Meeting Adjourned at 9:10 p.m.

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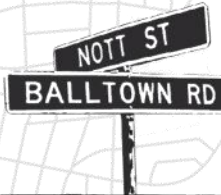

All meetings held at Mohawk House at First Reformed Church

May 2, 2018

President's Report: Annual report for June 2017- May 2018 will be distributed to members at May annual meeting.

Standing Committee Reports

Spy-Year end report - Gloria Kishton will no longer do the design work. **Finance**-One application for sidewalk incentive received and will be notified to proceed. Funding depends on compliance with city regulations. **Committee on Safety** - Annual picnic will be July 31. National Night Out in Central Park on Aug. 7. **Membership** - Those who join after May 17 will be joining for the following year. **Event Committee** - Sidewalk Sale, Sat. June 9 with a rain date of June 10. Forms available at annual meeting. **Nominating Committee**-Nominations will be presented at the annual meeting. **Old Business** I Love My City Park Day will be on May 5 from 10 a.m. to 2 p.m. Mr. Chilton reported on Earth Day trash clean-up. Park litter at Ingersoll, the playground and North St. will be picked up on a regular basis by a volunteer.

June 6, 2018 7:00 pm

Sidewalk Sale: Thirty tables have signed up.

National Night Out: Event on Aug. 7 to be held at Central Park. **Motion by Ms. Macaulay to donate \$100 to this event. Motion was passed unanimously.** **Garden Tour:** Ms. Kishton reported on plans for this year's tour on July 20 and 21. Advertising efforts include ad on Water's Edge Restaurant electronic bill board and table at the Farmer's Market on June 24. **Streetscape Project:** Steering committee has drafted a consultant Request for Proposals (RFP). Ms. Unger and Richard Unger are meeting with Directors of the City Development Department and Engineering Department prior to sending the RFP out to potential consultants. **Organizational discussion.** Board members signed conflict of interest statements for the current year, reviewed priorities, and identified strengths and challenges in the neighborhood. Discussion will continue as committees form and tasks are identified.

August 1, 2018 7:00 pm

SPY Presentation: Ms. Briber presented the calendar for the coming year. Discussion followed especially regarding Nott Street Office taking over the layout and design of each issue. **President's Report:** Reported on concerns with the location of gas meters and vents on Union St. as National Grid replaces the gas lines on Union St., Washington Ave., Church St. **SUN Membership:** Colleen Macaulay will be the delegate and Sue DuFour will be the alternate delegate to SUN.

Standing Committee Action items-

Infrastructure Maintenance- Keith Dayer reported two more trash cans installed, on College and Green and College and Front. Suzy Unger reported proposals have been received and the committee will review the proposals in a meeting on August 6. Board discussed the process that the board will use to approve the committee's recommendation.

Finance-Bob Lemmerman reviewed the YTD expenses and presented a draft of the budget expense categories and reported on the Garden Tour proceeds. All committees should submit budget items to Mr. Lemmerman before Sept. 5.

Repairs or painting using like colors & materials do not require approval (*but may still require a building permit*). Applications at: <http://cityofscheneectady.com/development.htm>. Questions?
